Hazelwood School District Guidelines for the prevention and preparation for Influenza (flu) and Coronavirus (COVID-19)

- School clinic staff will continue to educate our students, staff, and families on appropriate hand hygiene, proper respiratory etiquette, and our district's illness policy
- District faculty and staff are trained to send any student complaining of illness to the school nurse for evaluation
- All schools and departments have hand sanitizer stations conveniently located in each building
- Custodial Services has increased daily cleaning procedures during this viral season with additional cleaning efforts in high-student and high-staff contact areas such as doorknobs, desks, faucets, handrails, and drinking fountains
- Custodial Services has created additional daily cleaning procedures for manipulatives used in the preschool classrooms
- District nurses are monitoring students/staff with influenza like symptoms; reporting weekly diagnosed cases to District's Health and Wellness Coordinator
- Health and Wellness Services is following the St. Louis County Health Department's guidelines by sending staff and students with viral-like illness home
- Students who are identified with symptoms are isolated in the clinic until they are picked up
- Health and Wellness Coordinator will continue to work with our partners at the Department of Health and Senior Services and the St. Louis County Department of Health as they monitor and manage the current influenza and coronavirus situation
- District representatives attended the EdPlus, *Best Practice, and Approach in dealing with an Outbreak* - March 4
- Custodial Services will continue to provide additional supplies and training of proper virus disinfectant
- Held an informational panel discussion for principals and department heads to provide an overview of District processes for sanitation in schools, buses, cafeteria, etc. Also included: parent and staff communications, and addressed student and staff attendance handling - March 5
