HOW TO EARN COLLEGE CREDIT

Both dual credit and dual enrollment require students to be admitted into St. Louis Community College.

HOW TO EARN COLLEGE CREDIT

CREDIT FROM STLCC <u>CAN</u> TRANSFER TO BOTH <u>PUBLIC AND PRIVATE</u> COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES BOTH IN STATE <u>AND</u> OUT OF STATE.

CORE 42 SIMPLY <u>ENSURES</u> THAT THE CREDIT WILL TRANSFER TO MISSOURI PUBLIC COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES.

Credit transfer is ultimately up to the ACCEPTING college/university.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Am I ready for dual enrollment? Is my student ready for dual enrollment?

THE ACADEMICALLY MATURE STUDENT...

- Follows instructions as given.
- Adheres to deadlines and due dates WITHOUT excuses.
- Asks questions when they don't understand something.
- Utilizes their resources, without prompting, in order to be successful with their academics



Am I ready for dual enrollment? Is my student ready for dual enrollment?

THE ACADEMICALLY ADVANCED STUDENT...

- Completes assignments & tasks without being prompted.
- Has taken and passed more rigorous courses (i.e. Honors & AP)
- Adheres to deadlines and due dates WITHOUT excuses.
- Has a academic routine for studying and completing assignments.
- Has a G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher. *Seniors with a 2.5 & higher will be considered*

Do I automatically get to dual enroll?

No.

EVERY student must go through the application/approval process. This includes students who came through the HEMS 8th grade center.



Is Dual Enrollment free for all students?

No.

Students are awarded district paid dual enrollment.

Students who are not awarded district paid dual enrollment must self-pay. This is determined during the application process.

How to sign up for the Dual Enrollment application process.

- Complete the HEHS Dual Enrollment Interest Form.
 - Review the application process.
- Accept the invite to the Google Classroom where you will be lead through the DE Application process. Go through the application process with Ms. Smith-Butler to select appropriate courses for the related semester.

Once You Have Been Approved....

- Complete DE Authorization Form for the Approved Courses.
- Attend the HEHS/STLCC advisor session to register for your courses.
- Follow the provided directions to order the necessary books for class.
 - Double check to ensure that your HEHS schedule does not conflict with your College Courses.
 - If you are a student-athlete, double check to ensure that you have the appropriate amount of class credits to be eligible.

AS A DUAL ENROLLED HEHS STUDENT...

- Taking college classes is not an excuse for missing high school related tasks and assignments.
- You must keep up with your high school classes and requirements.
- IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR COUNSELOR, DUAL ENROLLMENT LIAISON, & TEACHERS.

- Students must maintain a 3.0 and above HEHS GPA to begin and continue dual enrollment. Senior students must have a 2.5.
- Student-Athletes must be enrolled and pass 3.5 credits in order to be eligible for MSHSAA sanctions activities/sports.
- Students must maintain a clean discipline record.

AS A STLCC-FLORISSANT VALLEY STUDENT..

- Being a "high school student" is not an excuse for late work or missing college related tasks and assignments.
- It is your responsibility to utilize resources such as tutoring and labs. No one will force you to do so.
 SUPPORTS ARE AVAILABLE.
- IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR TEACHERS, ADVISOR, & DUAL ENROLLMENT LIAISON.



HEHS students who are placed on Academic Probation by STLCC or do not maintain a minimum STLCC GPA of 2.5 will have to sit out a semester from Dual Enrollment before reapplying.





District-paid dual enrollment IS NOT GUARANTEED.

All Hazelwood East students will be considered for district-paid dual enrollment during the review of your Hazelwood School District DE Application.



Transportation to and from classes are ultimately the student's responsibility.

There is a shuttle bus that runs <u>on the</u> <u>days that Hazelwood Schools are in</u> <u>class</u>. The shuttle runs from EAST at 7:30am to STLCC and from STLCC at 12:15pm to EAST.



THERE ARE OFTEN NO EXCEPTIONS GIVEN FOR MISSED DEADLINES AND ASSIGNMENTS.

You MUST keep up with your STLCC & HEHS classes and requirements.



Students reapply every semester for dual enrollment approval.



Students who participate in a MSHSAA sanctioned activity/sport MUST maintain 3.5 credits of classes each semester.

This typically means that the student will take

<u>5 college courses and 2</u> courses at the high school.

> If the student does not pass or drops the enrolled courses IT WILL IMPACT THEIR ELIGIBILITY.
