- Credit Recovery (10th-12th grade students)
 - Credit Deficient students will have the option of taking courses through the virtual platform Edgenuity but will receive in-person support. Classes will include mixed courses but efforts will be made to pair students with certified teachers by content. Credit deficient students should meet with their counselors to plan which courses would be most beneficial to their overall educational plan. Students will be able to take two courses as part of the regimented program and add independent courses as their progress and interest permit.
