Progress Monitoring

- Instructors will send weekly progress reports home to parents
- Teachers/Administrators will monitor CR progress on Edgenuity
- Walk through data
- Students - self monitoring using data from school year (student voice and ownership)

Innovative/Creative/Fun Strategies to promote attendance:

- Weekly celebrations at lunch for students with perfect attendance for that week
 - Recognition of attendance
 - Recognition of academics

Strategies to address academic needs:

- Modification of coursework based on IEP needs
 - Accommodations/modification made in Edgenuity CR by SSD staff
 - Accommodations/modifications communicated by SSD to summer school staff (accommodations profile sheet) for each student
- Utilize school year data to create a plan for each individual student - build on where they left off (Previous year's grade level dashboard)
- 5th year and 2022 cohort students' luncheon for students and their families with a presentation from '22 graduates.

Enrollment process

- Counselors will communicate with parents to complete eform. Enrollment will follow the hierarchy below:
 - Summer school graduates - students that need to finish graduation requirements
 - Mandatory enrollment for students with core area failures
 - Students seeking enrichment opportunities
 - Outside/Private school students needing summer school that live in the EHS attendance area.
