

Hazelwood Opportunity Center 2022 Summer School Program

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Rationale

With the uncertainty of the pandemic and in person learning, Hazelwood Opportunity Center (HOC) has opted to provide virtual summer school for our students. Virtual summer school will ease the stress of staffing which is essential in dealing with our particular clientele. Our students thrive in an environment where relationships have been established and they feel safe due to the traumatic experiences that many of them have faced.

Schedule

HOC Virtual Summer School is slated to begin June 13, 2022 and end July 20, 2022 (no Fridays). Students will attend classes from 8:30 am to 11:30 am. From 8:00-8:30/11:30-12:00, students can receive any additional tutoring/support needed for their classes, which is considered the teachers' office hours. Classes will be held Monday through Thursday. Parents can make arrangements with teachers to meet if they have any concerns. The HOC Virtual Lobby will also be available for students/parents for questions/concerns. The HOC Virtual Lobby is manned by administration, the secretary, counselor, etc.

What Will Be Offered

- TABE Preparation
- HiSET Preparation
- Hazelwood Success Academy (HSA) Program
 - Tutoring in Math/English
 - Remediation
 - Credit Recovery
- Edgenuity will be the curriculum that will be implemented
- Missouri Options Program
 - The aim is to target students that are on the cusp of finishing their HiSET tests (1-2 tests)
 - Students that need to fulfill Hazelwood requirements for graduation such as Edgenuity coursework
- Project Restart Program
 - The aim is to target students with high TABE scores to prepare them for August testing (Score of 11+) In addition, we are also targeting those

students that are finishing health, government, or personal finance, but have high TABE scores so that they can enter Missouri Options in August)

- Students will work on USA Test Prep to prepare for TABE testing

Student Social/Emotional Support

As a result of the pandemic, HOC would like to offer support through employing a counselor to help foster connections throughout the summer months with students. In many cases, we lose our students due to the lack of connection/contact. Individual counseling, social skills instruction, parent meetings, the identification and sharing of resources are some of the duties that would continue with this position during the summer.
