Student dress code is defined as attire that will not disrupt nor distract from the instructional procedures of the school. The school administrator(s) or designee will make the determination if clothing is disruptive, inappropriate, or poses a safety hazard.

The following is a list that is intended to inform but not limit.

- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- Items of clothing that are inappropriate for school and are not permissible are shoes with wheels, flip-flops, tight-fitting clothing, and revealing or suggestive clothing.
- Headgear that interferes with the student being identifiable by adults or cameras is not allowed.
- Sunglasses and dark glasses are not allowed unless by prescription.

- Accessories that can be used as weapons, such as chains or combs, are not allowed.
- Clothing that promotes/endorses disruptive behaviors, non-inclusiveness, drugs, sex, alcohol, violence, gangs or illegal activities will not be allowed on school grounds or at school sponsored activities.
- It is also required that clothing be worn in the correctly intended manner.
