



## **Long Term Instructional Plan – Updated March 26, 2020**

Our schools initially developed 10 days of enrichment activities for students to do between March 18 and April 8, 2020.

Currently, our schools are closed through April 22, 2020. There is a possibility that school closures will extend past this date. Therefore, we have put together learning activities for the remainder of the school year in the event closures are extended.

The District has additional free online activities which are posted on the District website with regular updates. We have also put together a list of community resources to help our families during the extended school closure. Counselors, social workers, and home school communicators will continue to be available for families to reach out to guide them in getting the resources on this list.

*All district buildings will be deep cleaned during the school closure.*

### **Additional Information about Long Term Instructional Plan**

- Schools will distribute assignments along with textbooks, novels, and/or workbooks during the week of April 6<sup>th</sup> at specified and pre-announced dates and times.
- Beginning April 20<sup>th</sup>, online learning activities will be available to students in grades 3-12 through Achieve3000, Edgenuity, Google, Launch, Odysseyware, Project Lead the Way (PLTW), and/or Redbird Mathematics. Students will be able to work at their own pace, and teachers will provide feedback, answer questions, and grade completed work.
- All completed activities may be used to improve grades, but they will not hurt grades.
- Teachers will have specific “office hours” each day during normal school hours where students and parents can get questions answered via Class Dojo, email, phone, text, and/or Google. All questions will be responded to within 24 hours.
- Principals will respond to phone calls and emails daily. All questions will be responded to within 24 hours.
- Schools and teachers will also email and post activities on their school website along with additional instructions.
- Special Education teachers will provide support to students to meet their Individualized Education Programs (IEP) as needed.
- English Language (EL) teachers will provide support to students as needed.
- A list of community resources and additional free online learning activities are posted and regularly updated to the District website.
