How Do I Get My Child Enrolled in Preschool?

Your first stop is to schedule a free screening for your child to determine appropriate placement. Free developmental screenings are offered assessing vision, hearing, health, speech, language, motor skills and concepts. All children from birth to age five are eligible to receive this screening. The results of the screening are shared with parents to better understand each child's strengths and abilities, areas of concern and overall developmental progress.
