

Student Daily Health Screen

Answer No to all screening questions

- Temp is greater than 100 degrees
- New or worsening cough
- Trouble breathing
- Chills
- Congestion or runny nose
- Unexplained muscle pain/body aches
- Sore throat (different from seasonal allergies)
- New loss of taste or smell
- Diarrhea
- Nausea or vomiting
- Close contact with someone testing positive for COVID or having COVID symptoms

Student has been exposed to or has had close contact with someone diagnosed with COVID-19.

Close Contact Definition-Being within 6 feet of infected person for 15 minutes or longer, starting 2 days before close contact had symptoms or positive test.

Student should not come to school.
Notify your student's school attendance line.
Contact your student's healthcare provider for further instructions.

Quarantine the student, 10 days from close contact, and follow healthcare providers instructions.

Provide school nurse with any documentation you may have.

Student has tested Positive for COVID-19, with or without symptoms
Or student is having symptoms and is waiting test results.

Student should not come to school.
Notify your student's school attendance line.
Contact your students healthcare provider for further instructions.

Isolate the student. Isolation guidelines are 10 days from start of symptoms or the confirmed positive test.

A 'Letter or Isolation Release' is required from your healthcare provider, Department of Health or Urgent Care for the student to return to school.
