
#### What is your favorite part of the job you have?

### St. Louis County filings

In St. Louis County, County Executive Sam Page filed to retain the seat he was selected to by the County Council in April after the resignation of Steve Stenger. As expected, he drew two opponents in the Democratic primary: County Assessor Jake Zimmerman and retired marketing executive Mark Mantovani.

Paul Berry III, who lost to Stenger by 20 points in the general election in 2018, filed as a Republican. Theo "Ted" Brown Sr. of Riverview also filed to run on the Libertarian Party ticket.

Three County Council seats are up for grabs, and incumbents Kelli Dunaway, D-2nd District, Rochelle Walton Gray, D-4th District, and Ernie Trakas, R-6th District, each filed for reelection.

Walton Gray faces a challenge in Democrat Mark Behlmann, president of the Hazelwood School District board of education.

Two Democrats filed in the 6th District: Alex Lange, a union representative for United Food and Commercial Workers Union Local 655 from south St. Louis County, and state Rep. Bob Burns, of Affton, who's facing a term limit in his fourth term representing the 93rd District.
