

Washington University announces local College Prep scholars

Scholars get into top-choice schools, earn millions in scholarships

Washington University in St. Louis has admitted 49 rising high school sophomores to its innovative College Prep Program, a multiyear initiative that prepares high-achieving students with limited financial resources for college.

The students represent public, private and charter schools from across the region. They will live and study on campus for three summers, participating in science labs, preparing their college essays and studying with top university faculty.

This is the sixth cohort of the College Prep Program. Launched in 2014, the program recently celebrated the graduation of Cohort 3, all of whom were accepted into colleges such as Yale University, Johns Hopkins University and Spelman College. Six scholars will attend Washington University through the College Prep Scholarship. All together, Cohort 3 scholars were awarded more than \$3.7 million in scholarships.

"We are excited to welcome a new cohort of aspiring inventors, artists and leaders," said College Prep founder Leah Merrifield, associate vice chancellor for community engagement and St. Louis college readiness. "Over the next three years, these students will acquire the skills to not only to get into their top-choice school, but to succeed there.'

Hazelwood West Student Named Gatorade MO Boys' Track & Field Athlete of the Year

Hazelwood West High School's Justin Robinson has been named the 2018-2019 Gatorade Missouri Boys Track & Field Athlete of the Year. The award recognizes both athletic excellence and high standards of academic achievement and character demonstrated on and off the track, and distinguishes Robinson as the best high school boys' track & field athlete in Missouri.

Robinson, who just completed his junior year, won three individual events and anchored the winning 4x200 relay team at the Missouri Class 5 State Championships this past spring. He won the 100-meter dash with a time of 10.56 seconds, the 200-meter in 21.96 seconds, and the 400-meter in a state-record time of 46.30 seconds; his performance also helped the Hazelwood West Wildcats win the Class 5 team championship.

Robinson's season-best time of 44.84 seconds in the 400 ranked as the nation's top performance among prep runners in 2019 at the time of his selection; that time also ranks second in American prep history. He also volunteers locally as a mentor for young athletes and maintains a B average in the classroom.

"Justin has become the best high school 400 runner in the U.S., but that's not his goal," West High School coach Tim Levine said. "His goal is to be the best 400 runner, period. For the first time in my coaching career, one of my athletes has a legitimate chance to be an Olympian. It's no guarantee, but the talent, work ethic, focus, and intangibles are all there." Robinson is second Hazelwood West student-athlete this the to earn 1999-2000 recognition, following Daniel Harris during the school year.
