'They were inseparable': St. Louis County brothers gunned down 6 months apart

For most of the last 19 years, Kelvin Phillips Sr. said, his sons Kelvin and Kelvon would spend every minute together. Though they were a year apart in age, they were very nearly like twins.

"They were inseparable," Phillips said. "You didn't see one without the other one. ... it was hard for Kelvon to cope with his brother not being there. He was taking it very, very, very hard."

Kelvin Phillips Jr., 19, was shot and killed in the 1000 block of Gimblin Street in St. Louis on Aug. 1. His younger brother, Kelvon Phillips, 19, was fatally shot Sunday in a Budget Inn motel parking lot in the Spanish Lake area. The brothers lived in the 11300 block of Rockgate Court.

The brothers both had played on the Hazelwood East High School football team and were stars, their father said. Both of them played running back and safety.

"Kelvin was kind of the more outspoken one. He liked to be the center of attention. He liked girls," Phillips Sr. remembered. "Kelvon was basically the exact opposite. He was laid back and quiet, but he had a smile and sense of humor that could light up a room."

Charges have been filed in Kelvon Phillips' murder against Ivan K. Henley.

<u>Ivan Henley</u>, charged with murder in St. Louis County in the death of Kelvon Phillips at a Spanish Lake motel on Feb. 17, 2019.

Henley was charged Tuesday with second-degree murder, armed criminal action, unlawful possession of a firearm and tampering with physical evidence.

Henley, 23, was hospitalized Wednesday. He was suffering from at least one bullet wound that, police say, could have come in a shootout with his victim. He was arrested after showing up at a hospital for treatment, said Officer Benjamin Granda of the St. Louis County Police Department. Henley is accused of <u>fatally shooting Kelvon Phillips</u> early Sunday outside the motel at 1405 Dunn Road. Phillips, 19, lived about two miles from the motel. Kelvin Phillips Sr. said Henley knew his son through school.

Henley and Phillips met on the parking lot, and Henley got into Kelvon Phillips' car and sat in the front passenger seat, police say. Henley used a 9mm handgun to shoot Phillips multiple times, police say. Henley ran off, taking a gun that Kelvon Phillips had with him, police say.

North County family grieves for sons murdered 6-months apart



ST. LOUIS COUNTY, MO – Unspeakable grief for parents in North County: they've now have two teenage sons shot to death since August.

The brothers were inseparable, their mother said, sadly even in death.

"They did everything together – even in death they've still got each other," said mother, Angel Mays.

She and the boys' father, Kelvin Phillips, Sr., are despondent.

Not quite a year and a half ago, Kelvin, Jr., and his brother Kelvon Phillips were in the backfield together playing Quarterback and Tailback at Hazelwood East High School. They wore numbers 1 and 2.

In a span of about 6 months, they've both been shot and killed. They were born a year apart. Both were 19 at the time of their deaths.

Ivan Henley, 23, is charged with 2nd-degree murder in Kelvon's death over the weekend, plus weapons offenses, and evidence tampering. Henley met Kelvon in a parking lot near the Budget Inn on Dunn road in North County, Sunday, and shot killed Phillips in Phillips' car, authorities said. Henley was also shot, and is in custody at an area hospital, according to authorities.

His bond was set at \$1,000,000 cash only.

On August 1st, Kelvin Phillips, Jr., was shot and killed on Gimblin Street near Newby in North St. Louis.

Police have identified Nicholis Campbell as a person of interest but have yet to find him.

"Come on stop hiding him. Stop assisting him," Mays said. "He has hurt my family. It's not ok. I will never see my boys again. That's a hurt nobody should ever have to go through. We were just somewhat trying to get over losing Kelvin and now it's like all over again. Call the police. Please help them, so I can finally start grieving."

2 St. Louis County brothers slain 6 months apart



ST. LOUIS (AP) — Authorities say two St. Louis County brothers whom their father described as "inseparable" have been fatally shot six months apart.

The St. Louis Post-Dispatch <u>reports</u> that <u>Kelvin Phillips Jr. was 19 in August when he was slain in St. Louis.</u> His younger brother, <u>Kelvon Phillips</u>, <u>also was 19 when he was killed Sunday</u> in a motel parking lot in the Spanish Lake area.

Their father, Kelvin Phillips Sr., says he "can't sugarcoat it, nobody is doing good." He says his sons were very nearly like twins, although they were a year apart in age. Both played football on the Hazelwood East High School team, where their father said they were stars.

A man has been charged in the younger brother's death, but not in the killing of the older brother.
