
Student Recognition Committee

Rosa Parks

On December 1, 1955, African American seamstress Rosa Parks was travelling in a Montgomery City bus when the bus driver asked her to vacate her seat for a white man. The driver's request was standard practice of racial segregation in buses *at the time*. Rosa Parks refused to leave her seat on the grounds of fairness, freedom and equality.
