Social media (Facebook, Twitter, and the school website) is utilized to announce school activities and etc. Communication regarding student success and areas in need of improvement take place via the distribution of 5 week progress reports, parent/teacher conferences, and through the use of Class Dojo, and our PBIS rewards system.
