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Hazelwood School District provides a variety of free summer school programs designed to strengthen students' skills in reading, writing, language development, problem solving, and math. Programs are designed to meet the needs of all learners through a highly personalized learning environment. Support is provided to English Language Learners (ELL) students who qualify for Title I services, special school district services and students with Reading Improvement Plans (RIPs).

Mission

Our mission at Brown Elementary is to promote the highest level of student achievement for all learners and to have a community built on respect and responsibility.

Vision

Brown Elementary will be a nurturing, collaborative community where students, staff, parents, and community members all work to foster creative, critical, and analytical thinkers.

RATIONAL

Academic proficiency, according to our MAP scores and district benchmark assessments, have remained stagnant and/or shown a decrease in reading and math as compared to other students in Missouri. Our students are capable of demonstrating high academic achievement, but are falling short of their potential. This summer school plan is to provide an additional 14 days of learning during the summer months to help minimize the educational gap that may exist, while also enriching the learning experiences for students needing additional challenges to exceed their potential.

STUDENT POPULATION

The summer school program supports students entering Kindergarten (Sunny Start) as well as current kindergarten-fifth grade students who live within Brown Elementary School's Attendance Area..

STAFFING ALLOCATIONS

- Teachers based on following staff ratio:
 - Sunny Start: 1 teacher and 1 BA/TA for every 15-20 students
 - Kindergarten-5th grade: 1 teacher for every 15-20 students
 - o 2 Literacy Tutors
 - o 2 BA/TAs
 - 2 Clerical (secretary & teacher clerk)
 - o 1 Nurse
 - 1 Counselor
 - Librarian shared with 3 other schools (1 day per week)
- Staff hours
 - Classroom teachers, librarian, counselor & nurse = 5.5 hours per day or 8:40-2:10
 - TA/BA & clerical = 5.5 hours per day or 8:15-2:15 or 8:00-1:30 depending on school needs.

- Students will be served breakfast & lunch in the cafeteria
- 20 minute recess TA/BA monitored
- Lunch will be provided, but there will be a charge based on their regular school year status

 - Utilize 3 standards per content area based off of EOY assessments

REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Begins March 20th and ends May 26th for transportation to/from school
- Registration will be completed through SIS utilizing an e-form
- May 26th is the last day to receive bus transportation
- Summer School Advertisement
- The Summer School enrollment deadline is May 26, 2023 with the exception of Sunny Start enrollment. *Per federal guidelines and the HSD Summer School plan, which is submitted to DESE, all children eligible for Sunny Start will be allowed to attend, as they enroll. The district is not allowed to decline services or develop a "waiting list".*
- Sunny Start and Kindergarten Enrollment When students enroll for Sunny Start or kindergarten, it is the building administrator's responsibility to ensure that student pictures are taken and uploaded into SIS.
- Supervisors should make sure teachers have name tags which include student name, mode of transportation (if bus riders see detailed information under Transportation Section) and room number ready for all students in Sunny Start and kindergarten.

Illness/First Aid/Covid Contact Tracing

There is a school nurse at our summer school location. If for some reason the nurse isn't present, the student should be referred to the clerk. Students' medical issues are documented in SIS, and the nurse will communicate major medical issues to all appropriate staff. Contact Tracing and Quarantine will be conducted by the nurse and administrator..
