Session Description and Grade Level Essential Standards

Each student will be assessed throughout the summer session. Teachers will utilize end of year data to have a starting point for student progress. Students can be assessed with SRI, Aimsweb and assessments created on Mastery Connect.

Reading will follow the instructional framework as shown on the lesson plan template. This continues the work of phonics, word study, vocabulary, minilessons, shared reading and small group instruction in reading. Math will focus on the rapid release model that is also shown in the lesson plan template. Exit slips will be given to track students formatively and provide quick information for teachers. Essential Learning Outcomes (ELOs) and priority standards will be the focus for the duration of summer school.

Students will be assessed prior to the end of summer school to show growth.

Additional Considerations

- Uniforms are NOT required for summer school.
- Class sizes will not exceed 15 students during summer school to allow for safety policies, precautions, and social distancing. If the enrollment exceeds 15 students, a combined grade level class will be formed.
- Students will bring a water bottle from home since drinking fountains are closed.
- Class Dojo will be used as classroom behavior monitoring and parent communication.

 teachers.
