Behavior Tips for the Store

- ★ Tell your child ahead of time if you will or won't be purchasing a toy/snack. If they ask anyway, you can remind them about the conversation. Stick to what you say. It will make it easier next time.
- ★ Talk to your child about specific rules for the store prior to going. Ex: "Stay with me." "Use walking feet." "Turn our listening ears on."
- ★ Have your children help by marking things off a list or putting stickers on items as you add them to your cart.
- ★ Bring the children to the store hungry and give them a snack while you are shopping.
- ★ Schedule an activity that your child enjoys after the store visit so they have something fun to look forward to, if they follow the rules.
