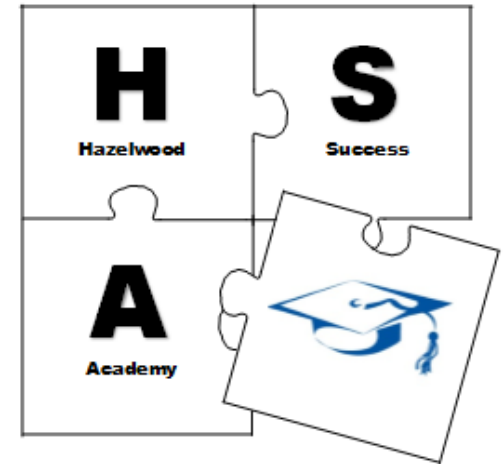

What is the Hazelwood Success Academy?

The Hazelwood Success Academy (HSA) is a full-day alternative education program designed for high school students in the Hazelwood School District who seek academic, social, and personal growth in a small learning environment, and/or are experiencing difficulty in their traditional school setting.

Students will receive instruction from certified classroom teachers and will complete elective courses via the Edgenuity on-line learning program.

The maximum number of students in the program will not exceed one-hundred fifty (150).

How do I apply?

Students who wish to attend HSA will complete the following steps:

- Pick up an application in the high school guidance counselor's office and complete it with your parent/guardian.
 - Applications will be forwarded to the Director/Principal of Alternative Education for review, and processed on a first-come first-served basis.
 - The Director/Principal will either:
 - a) make a recommendation to the student's counselor to provide additional supports at the home school
- OR**
- b) move the application forward for continued processing. (Applications may be placed on a waiting list.)

- Once space is available, or once a semester, HSA staff will contact the parent/guardian for a meeting. Students and their parent/guardian must attend this meeting with the staff of HSA.
- HSA staff will contact the parent/guardian within a week of the meeting regarding the student's status and recommendations for educational programming.

Q: Where is HSA located?

A: The former East Middle School building located at 1865 Dunn Road, St. Louis, Mo. 63138.

Q: What are the hours of HSA?

A: The hours of the program are from 7:35 am- 2:06 pm.

A: Students will earn a Hazelwood School District diploma (24 credits).
