Budget Principles

- Use the district's mission, vision, values and accountability plan as a guide
- Maintain fiscal integrity by budgeting conservatively
- Multi-year budget planning assists in making sound fiscal decisions
- Avoid deficit spending over the long-term
- Maintain fund balance parameters over time
- Follow staffing models consistently



Budget Principles

- Protect positions closest to students
- Continue professional development and support of staff
- Maintain a transparent budget process
- Decisions about reduction of personnel must be sustainable over time
- Maintain systematic budget reduction decisions
- Preference will be to eliminate positions through employee attrition when possible

- Major operating revenue changes (millions)
 - Decrease in Mills TIF surplus
 - Decrease in delinquent taxes
 - Increase in state sales tax
 - Increase in state formula
 - Increase in state and federal grants
 - Increase in other revenue

Total increase

- \$.7
- + \$.5
- + \$.5
- + \$ 1.7
- + \$.4
 - \$ 1.9 million



- Major operating expenditure changes (millions)
 - Increase in state and federal grants + \$ 1.4
 - Increase in salaries and benefits + \$.6
 - Decrease in curriculum & textbooks \$1.7
 - Increase in technology + \$1.7
 - Decrease in other expenditures \$.1

Total increase \$ 1.9 million




- Future revenue concerns
 - Expect continued refunds to commercial and residential taxpayers for prior year protested taxes whose cases are finally being settled
 - Potentially another \$3 million revenue loss over the next 2-3 years



- Currently have excess balances (savings) to absorb some operating shortfalls to protect instructional programs
- Not sustainable
- Need to continue to review operations for efficiencies and expenditure reductions





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
